


Why don't Christians spend much time learning about the third Person in the God-head: the **Holy Spirit?**



- Our limitations are also based on how we interpret Bible passages that reveal the indwelling and/or work of the Spirit.

One of the best...hardly used tools of Bible study - truly listen, digest, what is being said/studied.




If Faith in an understudied subject is the goal, listening must be a prime virtue.

When Someone else speaks...

Give that person respect...
they want to learn or impart
what they know.







In the beginning... (Gen. 1:2) THE SPIRIT GIVES LIFE

- The newly created earth was created but lifeless/uninhabitable.
- In it was God's creative, life-giving and powerful presence, ready to work.
- God gives His breath (Spirit) to give life where there is none. Ps. 104:29-30; Gen. 2:7
- SUMMARY: Closely connected to LIFE is God's Spirit. Gen. 6:3 (cp. Jn. 6:33; Jn. 3:8)



God's Spirit of Prophecy (Gen. 41:38)

- While it is likely Pharaoh did not know about the Holy Spirit he knew this much...
 - No man could know what Joseph knew. Gen. 41:15-16, 38-39
 - Joseph prophesied ("interpreted")
 Joseph's dream by way of God's Holy
 Spirit. Cp. 2 Peter 1:20-21



O.T.: Filled with the Spirit of God


- Joseph (already noted). Gen. 41
- Bezalel. Exo. 31:30-33
- Judges:
 Othniel (Judg. 3:10); Gideon (6:34);
 Jephthah (11:29); Samson (14:6)
- King Saul. 1 Sam. 10:10; 16:14; 19:23
- King David. 1 Sam. 16:13
- Others (in notes)




Summarize O.T. Quick Survey

- When the Holy Spirit of God came on/in people:
 - They revealed divine knowledge.
 - They could do things that they could otherwise NOT do.
- This would not necessarily permanent.
- God's Spirit could also leave them.







Spirit's Presence in Jesus Birth

- John the Baptist. Lk. 1:15
- John's parents. Lk. 1:41, 67
- Mary (Jesus' mom). Lk. 1:35 (Matt. 1:18)
- Simeon. Lk. 2:25-27
- Anna (prophetess). Lk. 2:36 (2 Pet. 1:20-21)



Spirit's Presence in Jesus' Life

- His birth. Lk. 1:35; Matt. 1:18
- His baptism. Matt. 3:16
- His temptation. Lk. 4:1, 14, 18

Summary: Only through God's presence (His Spirit) can man - noted through the life of Jesus - make successfully through life's trials.



The Work of the Spirit in the Gospels

- He gives life:
 - Believer "born" of the Spirit. Jn. 3:8 (cp. Ezek. 36:25-27; Job 33:4); Jn. 7:38-39
 - Believers baptized by Him. Mk. 1:8 (Acts 1:5)
 - He is given to those who ask God. Lk. 11:13
- He gives power:
 - To speak God's divine will. Mk. 13:11
 - *To do miraculous things. Matt. 10:1 (Matt. 12:28)
- Rejecting His work. Matt. 12:18-37



The H.S. in the Book of Acts

Mentioned in 57 verses in Book of Acts

- "...He through the Holy Spirit had given commandments..." 1:2 (21:4)
- "...baptized with the H.S." 1:5 (Joel 2:28)... "and receive power... to witness..." V. 8, 16
 - Fulfilled. 2:4, 17-21, 33 (Joel 2:28-32)
- "Receive the gift of the H.S." 2:38



"Filled" With the Holy Spirit in the Book of Acts

Notice the difference in the result of being "filled" in these passages:


- Apostles* (disciples?). 2:1-4 (1:14?)
 - Peter. 4:8
- Steven. 7:55
- Paul. 9:17, 13:9
- Disciples. 4:31; 6:3; 8:16 13:52
- Gentiles*. 11:15



Other Observations about the Holy Spirit in Acts

- He has authority. 1:2 (13:4; 16:6-7)
- Was lied to/tested. 5:3, 9
- He spoke through believers. 1:16 (2:4; 8:29; 10:19; 11:12)
- Given to those who obey God. 5:32 (15:8)
- Those "full" of the Spirit. 6:3, 5; 7:55; 11:24

The Holy Spirit's Gift to the World (John 16:8-11)

Convicting the world:

- Of sin. V. 9
- Of righteousness. V. 10
- Of Judgment. V. 11

Convicting the world of... SIN

- The goal of the Holy Spirit is to convict this ungodly world of unbelief... that Jesus is the Son of God who came to save sinners.
- Refusing the Spirit guarantees the loss pardon for their sin.

Matt. 12:24-31



Convicting the world of... RIGHTEOUSNESS

 Jesus, judged to be unrighteous and crucified on a tree (Gal. 3:13), was vindicated by His righteousness (Acts 3:14-15).

 The Holy Spirit's role is to convict the world of this truth. Cp. Acts 26:15-18; 2 Cor. 3:17

Those who turn from this world to God, by believing Jesus to be the Christ, will not just be convicted of righteousness but live it out.



Convicting the world of JUDGMENT

- The ruler of this world has already been judged. Col. 2:15 (Lk. 10:18; Jn. 12:31)
- While judged Satan still works to take down as many as he can. 2 Pet. 5:8
- The Holy Spirit convicts the world of their similar end should they reject His message. Acts 17:30-31





The Holy Spirit Dwells Within Us Literally Vs. Metaphorically

Literal

The Holy Spirit
 Actually dwells
 within us



Metaphoric

 The Holy Spirit does not actually dwell within us. He "metaphorically" dwells within us. He dwells within us ONLY through God's word.

Literal

 The person of the Holy Spirit dwells within us.

Metaphoric

 The presence of the Holy Spirit dwells within us.



Literal

 The person of the Holy Spirit imparts gifts to us (NOT ability to perform miracles).

Metaphoric

 The person of the Holy Spirit imparts gifts to us (NOT ability to perform miracles).

Arguments for a Literal* Dwelling

- 1. The Holy Spirit exists as a (divine) being.


 Matt. 1:18, 20
- 2. Numerous places refer to the His dwelling in us. Jas. 4:5; Rom. 8:9; 2 Tim. 1:14
- 3. Each person has a spirit dwelling within them.1 Cor. 2:11
 - 4. Other spirits have dwelt "literally" within humans. Acts 16:18 (Matt. 10:1); or animals (Matt. 8:28-32)
 - 5. Our bodies are said to be a temple (house) for the Holy Spirit to dwell within. 1 Cor. 3:16-17, 6:19-20



Arguments for a Metaphoric Dwelling

- 1. The Holy Spirit is omnipresent: NOT limited by physical boundaries. Psa. 139
- The word "dwell" does not always necessitate a literal indwelling but can mean to influence: sin (Rom. 7:17); truth (2 Jn. 2); God's word (Col. 3:16)
- 3. Christians are told to "be filled with the Spirit". If the Holy Spirit is already in us...why do we need to be filled with Him? (Eph. 5:18)





Gifts of the Holy Spirit Practical benefits of God's Spirit in our lives


Gifts from the Holy Spirit Rom. 12:6ff; 1 Cor. 12:4ff

- "Miraculous" gifts: prophecy, wisdom*, knowledge*, faith*, healing, effects of miracles, distinguishing spirits*, tongues, interpreting tongues.
- "Non-miraculous" gifts: serving, teaching, exhortation, giving, leadership, mercy




Fruit (Evidence) of the Holy Spirit

Word of God and the Holy Spirit



A Very Close Connection

- Men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit. 2 Pet. 1:21
- ...the Spirit of Christ who was in them was indicating when He testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ and the glories that would follow. 1 Pet. 1:11
- But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery.... But God has revealed them to us through His Spirit. 1 Cor. 2:7-10

The Divine Revelation of Redemption



The Holy Spirit's Primary Work

- God wanted man to know the truth...
 - How he (man) came into existence
 - How sin came into the world
 - How He (God) would bring redemption to sinful man... through His Son.
- The Holy Spirit's work: to reveal these truths (aka 'the truth') to the world.



For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God. Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God.

1 Corinthians 2:11-12



how that by revelation He made known to me the mystery (as I have briefly written already, by which, when you read, you may understand my knowledge in the mystery of Christ), which in other ages was not made known to the sons of men, as it has now been revealed by the Spirit to His holy apostles and prophets:

Ephesians 3:3-5



We Have The Spirit's Sword Now

- God's word is our means of sharing the truth (that the Holy Spirit provided through the holy apostles and prophets) to a world who needs redemption.
- The effective work we have is in sharing this revelation. 2 Cor. 5:14-20
